## Aviva visa application form

If you invite a foreign friend or relative to visit you at your home in the United States, one of the first problems that needs to be solved is that the person will be able to prove the satisfaction of the U.S. consular officer that he can afford the trip (and therefore will not be tempted to stay in the United States and find a job). If you think that person will have trouble showing the ability to cover the costs involved and to return home on schedule, you may want to consider providing U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) Form I-134, Affidavit of Support by signing on to I-134. This article provides information to help you fill out the I-134 form to help foreign tourists apply for tourist visas or other temporary visas. If you are an American citizen who is required to submit an I-134 form along with part of a K visa application for a foreign fiancé, you can find more specific advice on how to fill out the I-134 form for a fiancé visa, or if you are supporting a relative for a green card. This means that if they can show that they have enough money to pay for their expenses (such as food, accommodation, transportation and any emergency medical treatment), they will not be able to obtain a visa at the U.S. Embassy or Consulate, or may be denied entry to the U.S. Border Force if they are visiting the United States in the Visa Waiver Program (VWP). When you fill out the I-134 form, you will be assured to the U.S. government that the disproportionate person you are supporting does not need to apply for public assistance, such as security supplementary income (SSI), temporary assistance for needy families (TANF), food stamps or other government-subsidized benefits. If your foreign tourists join the public assistance, eventually the responsible government agency can consider your income and/or property when deciding whether to provide benefits or not. In addition, the government can sue you for recovering the cost of providing public assistance to your relatives. However, the temporary testimony of support on Form I-134 is often cited by legal experts as unenforceable, especially when compared to the longer-term I-864 parties submitted by U.S. citizens and permanent residents when providing foreign relative support for green cards. There are a few reasons why I-134 is called unenforceable: Most government agencies don't have the time or resources to enforce I-134 requirements, even if temporary visitors receive public assistance. Sponsor I-134 agrees to support immigrants for a limited and specific period, so the potential liability will be limited. If you live in the United States at different times, give the date you started living in the United States recently, Part 2: Information about the beneficiary in this section provides personal information about the bad person you are providing support to and the spouse or child who will travel with him or her (or join him or later). If you are unemployed or on low income, consider allowing someone else to fill out the I-134 form, if any, you will be asked to specify the amount you have in a financial institution in the United States, which means that banks and investment firms holding audit accounts, deposit certificates and other accounts with cash in deposits. If you are listing personal property, you can give the estimated value of vehicles, jewelry, appliances and other assets that you want the government to take into account. For real estate, you can use valuation services such as Zillow (which is not entirely reliable) or hire a professional appraiser. If you are a non-resident who pays taxes abroad, you should list a small child or an adult who has been appointed as a parent. Make sure to sign and date your Form I-134. The rest must be filled out only if someone helps you with I-134, such as an interpreter or a lawyer. In most cases, it will be enough to provide a copy of your latest federal income tax form (or tax certificate), but you may want to include a letter from your employer and bank to confirm your employment and money in a U.S. bank account. Make sure to provide two copies of any copies you submitted with form I-134 (and keep a copy for your own notes). Here's some evidence that others have used to show that they can support non-anonymous visitors: evidence of the latest federal income tax return. The best proof is the IRS tax certificate, the official summary of your tax return. Information about ordering a tax certificate can be found on the IRS website, but if you are subject to a time crunch, you can send a private copy of your signed tax return. A copy of the state return is not required. This will be on the official company letterhead and drafted and signed by your HR officer or boss or employer. Make sure that includes the last date, employment date and employment period, the nature of your position (if your job is full-time and permanent, make sure he or she notes it!) and your annual salary. Typically, it specifies the account opening date, last year's total cash deposit, average balance, and current balance. You can also provide the latest bank statements. It is likely that you will not need this document if you are just an anonymous sponsor during a temporary visa visit. However, if you want to strengthen evidence of your financial situation, you may include copies of names and deeds for residential vehicles and other property, including receipts for electrical appliances, electronics or any large-scale ticket items. What will happen next, do not send a letter form I-134 to USCIS or other government agencies, send the original Form I-134 to the noncitizen that you intend to provide support so that he or she can combine with the visa application of or take it to the U.S. Consulate where he will apply for a tourist visa.
